VACCINE UPDATE

Throughout this pandemic, our first priority has always been the safety and security of all Canadians. That's why we've secured the most number of COVID-19 vaccine doses per capita in the world – putting Canada at the front of the pack to receive the vaccine. The federal government is covering the costs of the vaccines and the supplies needed to administer them, as well as coordinating the logistical aspects of vaccine deployment across the country through the National Operations Centre, which is supported by the Canadian Armed Forces. By September, we'll have enough vaccines for every Canadian who wants one. Our top priority is keeping you and your family safe.

The federal government is covering the cost of these vaccines, as well as the supplies needed to administer them, so all Canadians who want a vaccine will receive one by September 2021.

HELP FOR SENIORS

As seniors age, they are more likely to outlive their savings, have disabilities, be unable to work and be widowed—all while their health care costs are rising. To help address these pressures, our government has taken ambitious and progressive measures to help seniors' financial security. Here is a snapshot of what has been done, and the work that continues.

Stronger income security

- Restored age of eligibility for OAS and GIS to 65 years
- Increased GIS by \$947
- Increased GIS earnings exemption
- Increased the Basic Personal Amount for income taxes
- Committed to increasing OAS and boosting CPP survivor's benefit
- Bringing forward a Disability Inclusion Plan, which will include a new Canadian Disability Benefit modelled after GIS

Health and well-being

- Invested an additional \$6 billion in home care and community care
- Building new affordable housing units for seniors
- Created the Canada Housing Benefit which will help low income seniors afford their rent
- Created Canada's first National Dementia Strategy
- Passed the Accessible Canada Act, which will provide more consistent accessibility across the country
- Created a Minister for Seniors to ensure seniors' interests are always at the Cabinet table
- Moving forward with foundational elements of national, universal pharmacare
