#### CANADIAN DENTAL CARE PLAN

Every Canadian deserves good oral health care, yet one-third of Canadians are unable to visit a dentist because they do not have insurance.

#### **CURRENTLY...**

To address this shortcoming, our government introduced the interim Canada Dental Benefit late last year. The benefit provides payments up to \$650 per eligible child under 12 years of age, per year for two years, if the family's adjusted net income is under \$90,000. For example, if the family's adjusted net income is between

- \$80,000 and \$89,999, they will receive \$260;
- between \$70,000 and \$79,999, they will receive \$390; and
- under \$70,000, they will receive \$650.

We are making great progress on the enrollment for the interim Canada Dental Benefit for eligible children under 12. The Benefit has helped <u>over 250,000 children</u> in Canada get brighter and healthier smiles! In Saint Boniface—Saint Vital, close to 1,000 children have benefited from this program.

Parents can apply for dental care received by their eligible child back to October 1, 2022, so long as their child was still under 12 on December 1. For the second period, parents can apply starting July 1, 2023. To receive the Canada Dental Benefit, you need to make sure you have filed last year's tax return. This program is but a first step. In the 2023 Budget, presented by Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Chrystia Freeland in the House of Commons on March 28, we are expanding access to dental care.

#### COMING SOON...

The Canadian Dental Care Plan aims to cover Canadians:

- under 18 years of age
- seniors and
- persons with disabilities

who meet the income criteria

- family income of less than \$90,000, with no co-pays for those with family incomes under \$70,000 and
- do not have pre-existing coverage.

The Plan will further expand in 2025 to include **all** uninsured Canadians with family income under \$90,000.00.

Eventually, the dental care program will help up to nine million uninsured Canadians get the dental care they need, and they won't have to choose between taking care of their teeth and paying their bills.

## **U.S. PRESIDENT BIDEN'S VISIT TO CANADA**

The Prime Minister welcomed U.S. President Biden to Canada earlier this spring. On a two-day official visit to Canada, President Biden made a joint address to Parliament. A series of new funding initiatives were announced during his visit, including:

- Increasing investments to up to \$250 million in the Canadian semi-conductor industry;
- Addressing irregular migration by expanding the Safe Third Country Agreement to unofficial ports of entry;
- Investing \$100 million in additional equipment and support for the Haitian National Police to support peace and security in Haiti; and
- Investing \$7.3 billion in infrastructure to support the arrival of our F-35 fighter jets, from our \$38.6 billion NORAD modernization plan, and confirming Southern Ontario will be the location for one of Canada's early warning and threat tracking systems.

Canada and the United States share the longest and most secure border in the world, where approximately \$3.4 billion worth of goods and services crossed daily in 2022. We will continue building on our historic partnership and close friendship to make life better for people on both sides of our shared border.



## **FESTIVAL DU VOYAGEUR**

In February, the Festival du Voyageur, the largest winter festival in Western Canada and a signature event in our riding, celebrated its 54<sup>th</sup> edition. This year was particularly special: it was the first time since the pandemic began three years ago that we gathered in person for this celebration. It was a pleasure to meet with fellow citizens

and speak to constituents from all walks of life about issues of concern to them.

The Festival du Voyageur is recognized beyond our borders as an annual gathering in the middle of winter that celebrates our joie de vivre and the Francophonie. Inspired by the era of the "voyageurs," it showcases Franco-

phone, Métis and Indigenous culture through music, dance, sculpture, visual arts and cooking. Visitors and artists from all corners of Winnipeg, Manitoba and Canada -- even beyond Canadian borders – joined us as we celebrated our community as a winter city. The Government of Canada is a proud partner of the Festival du Voyageur.

The French language has existed in Manitoba for hundreds of years. To ensure its survival, we must continue to invest in the institutions that are at the very heart of our communities.

This is why it is so important that we keep investing in the top-quality French-language postsecondary programs offered right here by the Université de Saint-Boniface and by other institutions across Canada, so that all young Francophones have access to the resources they need to succeed in their mother tongue.
